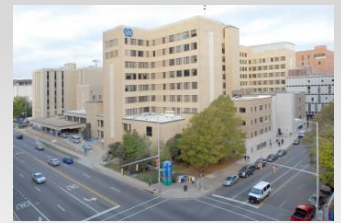


PGY1 Pharmacy Residency Program

The Birmingham VA Health Care System is a progressive teaching facility accredited by The Joint Commission and affiliated with the UAB School of Medicine. It serves as a referral center for Alabama and surrounding states to provide acute tertiary medical and surgical care, as well as numerous medical specialties, including Neurology, Psychiatry, Geriatrics, Infectious Diseases, Hematology/Oncology, Palliative, and Home Based Primary Care. The PGY1 Pharmacy Residency at the Birmingham VA Health Care System offers comprehensive training, with an emphasis on clinical pharmaceutical care, where residents are directly involved in patient care, as well as, pharmacy operations. Residents will also have ongoing teaching responsibilities to pharmacy students and hospital staff. Pharmacy residents will advance their knowledge and skills to become competent clinical practitioners through training in multiple required and elective rotations.

Application Requirements

- Completed PhORCAS application
- Deadline – January 3, 2022
- Curriculum Vitae
- College of pharmacy transcripts
- Letter of intent (with career goals and objectives for seeking a residency)
- VA application form (10-2850D)

Applicants must possess a Doctor of Pharmacy Degree from an accredited school or college of pharmacy, or a B.S or M.S. degree and equivalent training or experience. Interviews will be scheduled on evaluation of the application. Applicants will be ranked for selection based on qualifications and a personal interview.
