PGY2 Program purpose: PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in advanced or specialized practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care that improves medication therapy. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency should possess competencies that qualify them for clinical pharmacist and/or faculty positions and position them to be eligible for attainment of board certification in that practice area (when board certification for the practice area exists).

PGY2 ONCOLOGY PHARMACY RESIDENCY PROGRAM APPLICATION INFORMATION

Application Requirements:

All application materials must be submitted via PhORCAS. No application materials will be accepted via US mail, email or by submission in person. The following information will be collected via PhORCAS:

1. Applicant information such as demographics, colleges attended, professional experience, etc.
2. Curriculum vitae
3. Official transcript from accredited College of Pharmacy
4. Three reference submissions completed via PhORCAS standard process
5. Personal Statement - Outline your reasons for wanting to complete a PGY2 Oncology Pharmacy Residency and why you hope to pursue this goal at Norton Healthcare

The deadline is listed in PhORCAS, likely January 3, 2021.

All candidates will receive correspondence that their application is being reviewed. Likewise, all candidates will be notified regarding selection for an on-site interview. On-site interviews will occur in January and/or February 2021.

Note: All candidates will be asked to certify in PhORCAS that the information submitted in the application is complete and accurate. Norton Healthcare will seek permission, if necessary, to request additional information from previous schools and employers concerning candidate's academic record and professional ability. Candidate must be eligible for Indiana and Kentucky licensure according to criteria established by the respective Boards of Pharmacy (www.pharmacy.ky.gov; www.in.gov/pla/pharmacy.htm). The candidate must have completed an ASHP-accredited PGY1 program or one in the accreditation process. Alternatively, candidates may have an ASHP sanctioned PGY1 exemption (see PhORCAS for more information).
