Princeton Baptist Medical Center is a community-teaching hospital that provides internal medicine services by clinical faculty from Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy and Princeton Baptist clinical pharmacy specialists.

Program Purpose

PGY2 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (Pharm.D.) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency programs to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists in specialized areas of practice. PGY2 residencies provide residents with opportunities to function independently as practitioners by conceptualizing and integrating accumulated experience and knowledge and incorporating both into the provision of patient care or other advanced practice settings. Residents who successfully complete an accredited PGY2 pharmacy residency are prepared for advanced patient care, academic, or other specialized positions, along with board certification, if available.

Program Expectations

- Provide clinical pharmacy services to the Staff Medicine service patients
- Precept pharmacy students and co-precept PGY1 residents
- Take clinical call and serve as a backup to the PGY1 residents when on call
- Initiate, complete, and present a research project at a regional meeting, and submit for publication
- Develop and deliver an ACPE-accredited CE presentation
- Provide a lecture or lead a class session with Auburn University HSOP
- Serve on a hospital committee focused on improving care for internal medicine patients
- Achieve residency learning goals as required

Qualifications of Applicants

- Must possess a PharmD degree from an ACPE-accredited college or school of pharmacy and must have an Alabama Pharmacy license or be eligible for licensure as a pharmacist in the State of Alabama
- Must have completed an ASHP accredited PGY1 residency. Certificate of completion is due by July 5.
- Selected applicants will be required to visit PBMC for an on-site interview
- A 30 minute clinical presentation will be presented to the clinical specialists and pharmacy administrators during the interview

Application Information

Applications are due by **December 31, 2021**. All application materials should be submitted via PhORCAS (Pharmacy Online Residency Centralized Application).

Application packets must include **all** of the following:

1. Letter of intent
2. Curriculum vitae
3. Official transcripts of all professional pharmacy education
4. Three electronic references completed by healthcare professionals who can attest to your clinical practice abilities and aptitudes
 - a. Detailed comments must be provided
 - b. Two references must be from PGY1 residency rotation preceptors
